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1. INTRODUCTION

Sri Aurobindo Education Society (SAES) was founded in 1964 to foster in the coming generations the art of living a life full of love, peace, joy and fulfillment, a life that is meaningful to them and beneficial to others. With this overall vision, among its first activities was The Mother's International School (MIS). Today MIS has around 2400 students, and has been ranked among the best schools of the country in several surveys. In 2014, it received recognition as the school with the highest average score in the Senior Secondary Examination conducted by the CBSE.

In 1967, the SAES initiated a school of fine arts, Matri Kala Mandir (MKM). MKM conducts evening classes on the major classical Indian dances, instrumental and vocal music, painting, sculpture, and even martial arts such as Tae Kwondo. Adults wishing to learn these arts for self-expression and self-discovery are also welcome.

Mirambika Free Progress School, another educational institution run by the SAES, was founded in 1981. It is an innovative school with about 150 students. Mirambika has been repeatedly recognized as the top innovative school in the country, the latest being its ranking as India's No. 1 Day school on the parameters of Life Skills Education, Conflict Management and Individual Attention to Students by the Education World India School Rankings 2014.

Efforts have been going on for the past four years to start Mirambika Institute of Science and Technology, an engineering college exclusively for girls, on the land allotted for the purpose of a college.

First proposal for getting approval from AICTE in this regard was sent in 2015 and approval was also received. However, as the NOC from The Directorate of Technical education, Govt of NCT Delhi and affiliation from IP University were not received, the college could not be started and the approval of AICTE, which was valid for two years only, lapsed.

Our second proposal for setting up the engineering college was again approved by AICTE in 2017. This time also the college could not be started for want of NOC and affiliation from Delhi Govt. and I P University, respectively.

The society filed a case seeking direction of the Court to the Delhi Govt to issue NOC. The matter is listed in the Delhi High Court for Oct 31, 2019.

As the second approval of AICTE, received in 2017, was valid for two years only, fresh application was submitted to AICTE for seeking their approval for the proposed engineering college. Our application has been accepted by AICTE and a Letter of Intent has been issued by AICTE, which facilitates the society to seek approval from AICTE within a period of three years.

Earth Day: 2022 Launch of Campaign for "Phasing



Out Single-Use Plastic"

Children were shown a video on "Welcome to Class 6", which consisted of the pictures of different activities of the previous batch of class 6 students.

Class XII Farewell 2022, April 4, 2022



The students of Class 11 bid a fond farewell to their seniors on April 4, 2022. The Basketball Court was transformed into a colourful stage for an ensemble of engaging performances.

The members of the Students' Council (2021-22) were the first to take to the stage, following which, the show that had been put together by Class 11, as an ode to their seniors, began. Energetic dances, ranging from Bhangra to Bollywood to Bharatanatyam; evocative melodies; and an entertaining, nostalgic skit — all interspersed with compering regaled the audience.



The seniors danced their hearts out, almost as if to compensate for the lost joy of the last two pandemic-struck school years. Fresh *chhola kulchas*, *samosas*, and the *Ashram's* famous chocolate cake were served and made for the most befitting snacks for the occasion. Class VIII Special Assembly, April 5, 2022

Prayers were offered and quotes by The Mother were recited in English, Sanskrit and Hindi. A short story was narrated by Ms. Hema Durgani on the importance of discipline. Class Coordinator, Ms. Neha Amar addressed the assembly by welcoming the students in the school after the long hiatus owing to the pandemic. Students were guided on regularity of work and the importance of self-reliance with a positive outlook towards the challenges that would present themselves in the ongoing academic session. CUET Orientation Workshop, April 16, 2022

The Common Universities Entrance Test (CUET) was introduced by the National Testing Agency, with the aim of providing a common platform and equal opportunities for candidates across the country for admission into Central Universities. An online session was conducted by senior faculty member, Ms. Malvika Pathak, in order to familiarize the Class XII students with the updated entrance examination patterns. The session covered important aspects of the test such as the test pattern and structure, the components of the test (subject test, language test and the general test). The entry requirements of prominent universities like Delhi University and Ambedkar University were shared. The question-answer phase was a befitting conclusion to the session. Overall, the session helped the students to gain clarity about the test and also gave students the opportunity to get their doubts clarified.

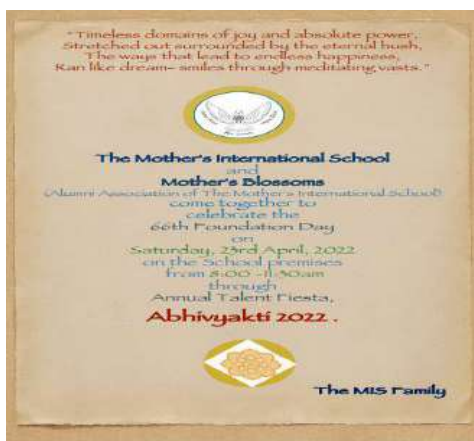
Investiture Ceremony, April 21, 2022

It was a fun-filled day, laden with interesting hands-on activities enabling experiential learning and skill building.



Population Day Debate, July 12, 2022



Population Day Debate, organized by the LYCEUM forum successfully explored a variety of subjects and encouraged students to express their opinions and hone their debating skills. World Population Day is celebrated every year on July 11 to create awareness on the importance of population of a country and population related issues. This also ensures open conversations among the youth on pertinent issues. The event began on a tranquil note as meditation music was played, creating an atmosphere of calm for both the audience as well as the nervous participants. This was followed by the presentation of an informative video on the ways in which India's demographic dividend can be effectively utilised by the state. The two esteemed judges for the event were Mr. Arjun Bhandari, alumnus of MIS batch of 2020 and Ms. Yashaswini Singh from Aawaaz Education Services. They contributed significantly to the richness of the debate, as both have widely participated and judged numerous prestigious debating competitions. Finally, the young debaters took the stage. The first team consisting of Risha Srinivas and Maanya Chaturvedi tactfully addressed their motion which dealt with the legitimacy of vaccine mandates imposed by the state. This was followed by five teams with different motions, ranging from issues like population policy to abortion to population collapse as well as environmental degradation. Finally, the judges gave their feedback and announced the results. Through the feedback, the teams as well as the audience learnt the importance of research, posture, structure and clarity in a formal debate. Team Pillowcases (consisting of Risha and Maanya) secured the second place and Team Inferno (consisting of Prachi and Kangana) won the first position. The judges announced that the second best speaker was Maanya Chaturvedi and the best speaker award went to Prachi Kapoor.

French National Day, July 14, 2022



14th July is the French National Day- when the ideals “Liberty, Equality and Fraternity” are celebrated. These are the pillars of society itself. During times when hatred, anger or conflict surface and the true spirit of humanity is threatened in the war-torn world, such celebrations renew hope. The French Department of MIS celebrated the day through a theatrical adaptation of Guy de Maupassant's short story "*Deux Amis*" upholding the virtues of love, friendship and humanity. IMKAAN Girl Up, July 16, 2022

Girl Up, MIS, hosted *Imkaan*, the first ever pitching and entrepreneurship event at the intra-school level. This event acted as a medium for the participants to creatively express and explore the issue of women in entrepreneurship, innovation and legislation in a constructive way. It also gave the speakers a platform to come up with viable real-world solutions to daunting problems faced in daily lives. Seven teams from classes 9 and 11 took part in the event, with individual participation as well as in groups of three. The event was judged by an esteemed panel of MIS alumni, who are currently engaged in the fields of activism, entrepreneurship and law. Judges Rasik Sachdev, Arushi Bahl and Nikitaa Rana awarded three positions, with one winner and two runners up. The second runner-up was Team 3 consisting of Anshika Shrivastav and Chinmayee Vidyalankar from Class 11, the first runner-up was Aaryaveer Jain of Class 11, and the first prize was bagged by Ritika Maan, also of Class 11. The event spurred enlightening and enriching discourse, while also highlighting various concerns that today's youth believe need to be addressed.

Intra class 'Nara Lekhan Pratiyogita', July 16, 2022



An intra-class slogan-writing competition was organised by the Hindi Department for class IX. All the students participated with great enthusiasm. They wrote catchy slogans and shared them through a colourful presentations. The following topics were given on the day of the competition:

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English Week, July 18-22, 2022



The beauty of the English language lies in its universality and ability to transcend boundaries in a world that is so diverse. English Week was celebrated to appreciate this very significance of the language.

The festivities for the Week were initiated by the poetry recitations put up by the students of Class 6 on the 19th of July. From humorous poems to uplifting ones, each section of the grade took on one poem and recited it in the assembly. The students of Class 7 were tasked with enacting scenes from their favourite novels dressed up as their favourite characters. ‘Melody in Verse’ taken up by Class 8 on the 21st of July, required the students to form groups of 6 members and pick out any one poem from a list of poems provided by their teachers and to set the chosen poem to a melody using instruments of their choice. This activity resulted in a plethora of captivating creations, including ‘Still I Rise’ by Maya Angelou set to the mellifluous tune of the Sitar and ‘I Wandered Lonely as a Cloud’ by William Wordsworth carefully crafted to a melody using the Hawaiian Guitar.

Next, the English Literary Club organised an online intra-school poetry writing competition for Classes 9-11 which accepted entries till the 22nd of July. Given the prompt ‘The roses have begun to shed their colour, and violets have begun to die, the parched ground waits for the rain, as grey and black cover the blue of the sky’, the participants were required to continue the theme and complete the poem in at least 16 lines, providing an appropriate title for their pieces. Each student offered a unique take on the prompt, displaying their creative interpretations through their writing. Hoshika Gupta of 11 A was announced the winner, for her poem titled ‘The Songs of Rain’.

On the 20th and 22nd, an enthusiastic murmur filled the Hall of Grace as the audience anticipated their class representatives’ speeches. The inter-section Declamation competitions held for classes 11-12 and 9-10, gave the students a platform to shed their inhibitions and voice their thoughts on the topics provided.

The students spoke on topics given a day prior to the competition, granting them time to prepare their speeches. While Classes 9 and 10 were given topics such as ‘Your thoughts are the architects of your destiny’, ‘Music is

the language of the spirit', 'You are the author of your life' and 'If winter comes can spring be far behind'. The topics for Class 12 were taken from Sri Aurobindo's sonnets, among which were 'My life is a throb of thy identity' from Bliss of Identity and 'There are two beings in my single self' from The Dual Being.

The wide array of topics encouraged the students to broaden their horizons and think creatively, allowing them to come up with insightful and thought-provoking speeches which were greatly enjoyed by the audience and judges alike.

English Poetry Festival: Class VI, July 19, 2022

During the English Week, class 6 participated in the Poetry Recitation Festival on July 19, 2022. The children



came on the stage together for the event after a long gap. There was complete participation across the sections and children were happy to be a part of this programme. They wore colourful clothes and used props to present the poems. Each section selected a poem, which they either enacted or sang.

Section A sang 'Touching the Sky' by Shreya D Chatree; section B sang 'Be the Best of Whatever You Are' by Douglas Malloch and section C sang 'See it through' by Edgar Albert Guest. These three poems refer to continuous growth of a person with effort and sincerity. Section D enacted 'The Tiger and the Zebra' by Kenn Nesbitt while section E sang 'Tummy Beast' by Roald Dahl. The event filled with excitement helped children to have fun while collectively learning something new.

English Poetry Festival: Class 3 to 5 (Primary Wing), July 20-22, 2022

The English Poetry Festival for classes 3 to 5 was celebrated in School from July 20-22. A collection of poems was recited by the children with immense enthusiasm. Each of the selected poems helped in imparting an important value or lesson. The props used helped the children in connecting with the poem while making each

poem a concrete experience for them. The beauty of expression, thoughts, the rhythm and the joy of reciting the poems in a chorus, filled the children with a sense of exuberance. To say the least, everyone enjoyed the fun-filled poetic mornings.

Infinity'22, July 26, 2022



Impulse, the Physics Club of the School successfully organised and executed Infinity'22. Many students participated in varied events that were planned. Infinity started with a two-day long cryptic hunt, Enigma. With questions revolving around well-known Physics phenomena and discoveries, Enigma proved to be challenging. This event was followed by a quiz, Fermi. The quiz offered a wonderful medley of several rounds of questions involving scientists and interesting natural phenomena. The events were enjoyed by everyone. Five teams competed in the final round.

MINET X, July 28-August 2, 2022



The annual tech symposium was organised by MINET from July 28 to August 2 with online prelims and offline finals and a total of 11 different events. With the support of the technology clubs of nearly 20 schools, X 2022 was conducted in an exemplary manner, a reminder of the power of technology.

On the first day, prelims for Pitching and Design were held. Participants show-cased bright futuristic ideas based on the theme given. The design teams brought out their creativity to present their projects in the most appealing manner, while the pitchers connected with the audience and gained enormous support for their ideas.

A select few winners were asked to go further to the next round, the gruelling mix of Pitching and Design and the flagship event of X - Make.



A programming event was the ultimate test of the brain, where programmers utilised their skills to show-case their talent to the esteemed panel of judges. Technology is a blend of knowledge and fun. This was evident in Gaming. Experienced gamers played a few rounds against each other as they battled to be the best. Complete with a little friendly competition, Delhi Public School emerged as the winner. The power of words was tested through Group Discussion as participants presented their views through logic with supporting data. Debating on challenging current topics, a participant from Bal Bharti Public School, Pitampura was awarded the first place.

“Knowledge becomes power when we put it into some use.” The quiz event allowed participants to turn technology-related general knowledge to their advantage and answered fun-filled and yet tricky rounds. After answering a series of challenging questions, Delhi Public School, Vasant Kunj was awarded the first prize.

In the famous words of Boris Pasternak, “Surprise is the greatest gift which life can grant us.” MINET offered that to each participant through the Surprise event. Tasks from ‘nagin dance’ to ‘surya namaskar’ unwrapped themselves as a pleasant (or not) surprise to the participants, who then had to complete them within a specified time. After some crazy and fun-filled tasks, Delhi Public School, Rohini received another surprise, the first prize.

“Faces are the most interesting things we see.” Participants of the photography event were tested for their eye for finding faces around them, be it a cloud-shaped face or the most random objects with a face like structure, and capturing those faces as beautifully as possible.



As the MINET website showcases, “Time for wordplay and bad puns.” The crossword event had participants guessing and brainstorming for potential answers. “In hunting, sometimes the thing you need most isn’t the thing you went looking for.” Yes, the challenging CryptX event, the cryptic hunt, had participants chasing the tiniest of details that led to the answer, each level being as tough as looking for a sparrow these days.

After all these challenging and thrilling events, Delhi Public School, Vasant Kunj, was awarded the rolling trophy for X 2022. All in all, X 2022 was a wonderful success because of how hard the club members worked to organise it with guidance and help from the teachers.

Accolades Day: Classes VI to VIII, July 29, 2022

There was an air of enthusiasm on July 29, 2022. Accolades Day for seniors was celebrated on 30th July 2022 to acknowledge the hard work and commitment put



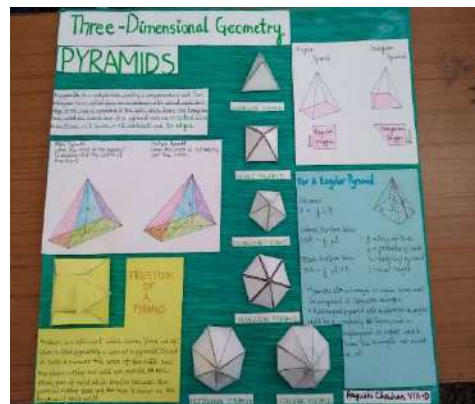

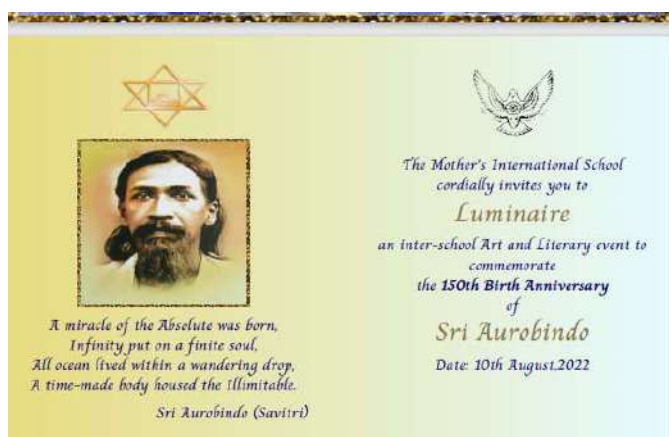
Fields Day-Mathematics Day, July 30, 2022

- *In each voice, I hear the magic tune*
- *A tree beside the sandy river-beach*
- *I heard the voices of an age unborn*

Students explored mystical ideas and undertook leaps of faith to transform abstractions into tangible poetic expression.

The Art event, 'Iridescent Voyages', came with surprises and more than anything continued to maintain its spirit. As soon as the competition started the excitement at the venue of the event was palpable. Refilling their cans of water, sharing their materials, exuding creativity and the joy of working together even while competing with each other. The participants were totally engrossed as brush strokes brought empty canvases to life. The artworks finally came together, and the Art Room was filled with vibrant canvases.

Declamation Competition in Hindi, '*Manthan*', was truly a memorable experience. The words of Sri Aurobindo evoked national pride and reiterated the fact that nationalism is not a political aspect; instead, it is 'dharma' itself. The declamation reemphasised that India's freedom is to be valued as it is a result of memorable sacrifices made by numerous known and unknown heroes. The Declamation Competition was impactful and left the audience with a sense of respect for the cherished legacy.

Sanskrit Declamation Competition, '*Tatvabodha*,' saw participants presenting their views on the topic 'Sri Aurobindo and the Bhagavad Gita'. All of them explored different perspectives and philosophical questions. The participants showed exemplary command over the language and spoke with confidence and fluency.

French Declamation Competition took up as its theme, '*Les Jeunesse d'aujourd'hui*' or 'The Youth of Today'. The participants shared new ideas and structured thoughts. Some even gave a beautiful recount of the life of Sri Aurobindo. Although each participant had a different way of presenting the views, all the participants wanted to convey the same message -- as the youth of the country, there are some essential qualities (*les valeurs*) that everyone must uphold to help protect the future of our planet.

The Rolling Trophy was awarded to Amity International School, Saket. 'Luminaire' successfully kindled the lamp of curiosity in young minds, setting them on an experiential and explorative journey to uncover beauty and truths hidden deep beneath the surface.



WHO- A Seeker's Quest, August 12, 2022

The School paid homage to Sri Aurobindo on his sesquicentennial birth anniversary with an offering- 'Who, The



Seeker's Quest' on the August 12. The production was based on Sri Aurobindo's short poem 'Who' resonating Upanishadic philosophy, replete with splendid imagery, felicity and cosmic truths.

The production saw the coming together of 90 enthusiastic participants and many dedicated teachers whose four-month long collective effort culminated in a resplendent visual treat. 'Who, The Seeker's Quest' was presented as a dance choreography, interspersed with the recitations of the verses. It was a harmonious amalgam of many dance forms, contemporary and classical, set to the tunes of diverse genres of music.

The theme of the poem, a seeker's eternal quest for the nature and identity of the Creator was well depicted with an array of props, music, dance, costumes and created an iridescent magic on stage. Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, August 13, 2022



Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is an initiative to commemorate the 75 years of India's independence, the glorious history of Indian people, culture and achievements. Diwali Celebration (Primary Wing), November 11, 2022



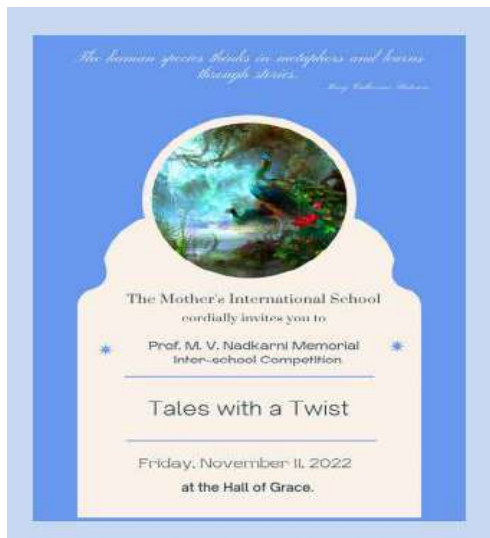

The participants were assigned various roles out of which the members of the Parliament posed questions to the ministers which were answered during the Question Hour that took place after the National Anthem and oath by the members. Following that a short duration discussion on 'Air Pollution' took place where the ministers along with the members of the Parliament stated the causes of air pollution and provided the assembly with valuable suggestions to solve the life-threatening concerns due to air pollution. It was assured by the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change that the suggestions provided by fellow members would be kept in mind and will be implemented to curb air pollution.

The next agenda of the Assembly was the debate on the Data Protection and Privacy Bill, 2022, where the members deliberated on aspects of the bill and put forward amendments for a safer experience on apps and websites for all citizens. The members voted upon the amendments and the bill was passed by a majority.

After the businesses of the Parliament were over, it was time to announce the winners of the Youth Parliament. With the encouraging words of the judges as well as the organiser, the winners were announced. The best question award was bagged by the Ministry of Law and Justice comprising Amayvikrama Narayan, Chinmayee Vidyalankar and Kavya Sinha. The best response award was won by the Ministry of Electronics and IT consisting of team members Hoshika Gupta, Yashvi Dutt Pant and Gunit Sahai. The award for the best discussion on 'Air Pollution' was bagged by the Ministry of Education comprising Sia Singh, Suryanshi Pinaki and Ihaa Gautam. The last but not the least award was the best debater on Data Protection and Privacy Bill, won by the members of Environment and Climate Change consisting of L. Laksmishree, Ishan Mishra and Shiv Arya.

The event turned out to be a great success. It provided students with a peek into the discussions, proceedings and workings in the Parliament.

Legal Awareness Day, November 23, 2022



The Legal Awareness Day celebrations highlighted that for being active citizens of a country, it is vital that students remain vigilant and aware of the rights provided by the Constitution of India. The students of Legal Studies shared information about certain legal procedures and terms.

The celebrations started with a short re-enactment of the first PIL to have ever been filed. Public interest litigation refers to action taken to secure the public interest. The play on Hussainara Khatoon case, a public interest litigation was written, directed and performed by the students of class 12. The play was followed by an informative and interactive presentation on the topic, “Cyber security: the need of the hour”, presented by Anshika Shrivastav, Vrinda Malhotra and Anav Garg. Cybercrime is a major issue prevalent in today’s modern society. Useful information about Information and Technology Act was shared along with the ways to keep oneself safe. An interesting video on ‘pause before you post’ aptly put the message across.

The last performance for the assembly was a song, written by Shirin Bhatnagar and Sia Singh of class 11 and performed by students of class 11. The song focused on various writ petitions, fundamental rights and duties of the citizens of our nation. The event garnered an extremely positive response, both from the teachers and the students.

Siddhi Day, November 24, 2022

The day began with a discussion on the significance of Siddhi Day in the classes. This served as an orientation to Sri Aurobindo’s spiritual seeking and philosophy. The Mother’s meditation music played as the students settled silently. The brightly lit *diyas* in the Hall added to the sublime beauty of the surroundings. The assembly commenced with a Sanskrit *shloka* chanting, ushering in peace. Sri Aurobindo’s belief in the dynamic truth of spiritual experience was conveyed through an introduction to *Siddhi Day*. *Bhajans* accompanied by melodious tunes on the flute set the tone to solemn recitations highlighting the significance of the day as well as the impact that was felt by devotees of Sri Aurobindo who were in his presence during that day in 1926. The Assembly brought alive moments of the great Master’s ‘*sadhana*’, in its very essence and concluded with a recitation of the poem, ‘Krishna’, by Sri Aurobindo. A calm, deep sense of meditation was felt, as if, a brief suspension of thought and action had occurred, and a heightened concentration was palpable. The Mother’s organ music played softly as the students dispersed in tranquil silence.

Annual Day Celebration, November 26, 2022

Sri Aurobindo belongs to the future. He is the messenger of the future. He still shows us the way to follow in order to hasten the realisation of a glorious future fashioned by the Divine Will. - The Mother (1972)

On the winter morning of 26th November, the MIS family came together for its Annual Day celebrations. It was after a gap of three years that an event of this magnitude was organised. The newly inaugurated Hall of Aspiration as the venue of the event generated much excitement. Shri Pradeep Narang, Chairman, Sri Aurobindo Society, Puducherry, presided over the function as the Chief Guest. Almost 800 parents and guests attended the event.

Before the commencement of the programme, a minute of silence was observed to pay homage to the fellow countrymen who lost their lives in the tragic Mumbai terrorist attacks on 26/11 in the year 2008.

The Head Boy, Keshav Saib accorded a warm welcome to the audience followed by the School Choir presenting *Abhinandan Shubh Swagatam*. The Principal, Ms Milan Mala Sarin, in her Welcome Address, elucidated the significance of the day and lauded the months of committed hard work of students and teachers alike. In her words, “It is the process which is most precious to us – that was a journey of discipline, learning at various levels and connecting very deeply with the flow of creation and collaboration.”

Annual Inter- House Athletic Meet, December 2 - 3, 2022



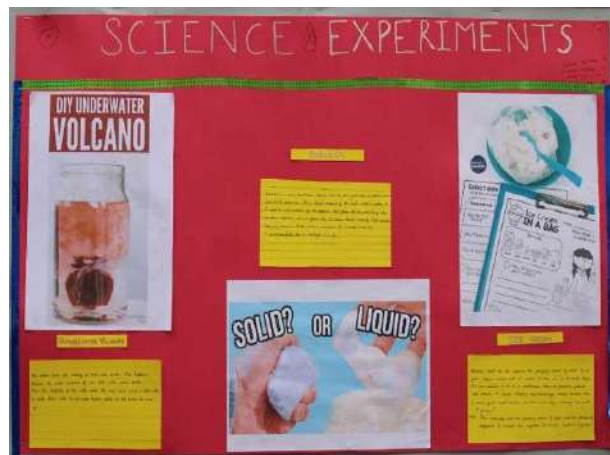

The events were for both categories of junior and senior boys and girls. Discus Throw and 4×400 metres Relay took place subsequently. The senior best athletes were Vatsal Bhushan Garg from Perfection House and Kaavya Nayyar from Honesty House. The junior best athletes were Aarav Mehta from Honesty House and Aradhya Porwal from Gratitude House. The sub-junior best athletes were Jairaj Singh from Gratitude House and Anshika Kumar from Perfection House.

Science Day, December 3, 2022



Three days into December, a foggy wintry morning with filtered sunlight, heralded a day full of celebration, surprises and new learning. Thrilled students and anticipative teachers looked forward to celebrating Science Day-2022 at The Mother's International School. A day, that aimed to see Science and Technology, real and up-close, through the events planned for the day.

The day began with an Assembly where students of class X shared a presentation highlighting Sri Aurobindo's writings with respect to Science, followed by an educative presentation by our Chief Guest, Dr. Mila Mitra, an astrophysicist, who spiked students' interest in STEM education. As one walked out of the assembly hall, one could view the badminton courts, labs and classes filled with science-based exhibits prepared for the day.

The students of class VI knit together Science with creativity to produce limericks, comic strips and riddles, based on scientific topics like the Human Body, the world around us, Motion and more while the others dressed up and shared stories and facts about famous scientists and their contributions. The students of class VII and VIII, took to the labs to present their elaborate creations. While each exhibit was captivating and informative, from grade VII, **Group II** presenting **The Laws of Physics**, **Group V** with a **Rube Goldenberg Machine** and **Group VII** with their **Water Turbine Model** won the hearts of the spectators. Similar to this, the students of class VIII presented experiments ranging from making nylon threads, displaying Friction, extracting nucleic acid from strawberries to games using electrical components and Magnetism.

her to start the Inspiration Foundation, a programme that taught underprivileged kids dancing, music, poetry, and painting. Her words were truly inspiring, and visuals of her dance performance captivated the engrossed audience.

Guest Speaker: Ms. Rashi Puri "A Discovery of Loss", January 19, 2023



Ms Rashi Puri, an alumna of the School, 2017 passout, addressed the assembly on the morning of January 19. She discussed her project, "A Discovery of Loss," which focused on exploring about pre-partition India, migration, and how the event is remembered by its survivors now, 76 years later.

Ms Rashi commenced the assembly in a very interesting and potentially thought-provoking way. She showed a picture of a city with both a mosque and a gurudwara in close proximity in the same lane. When she asked the seated students to guess where the picture

was from, some said it was Agra; others Delhi. Then, she revealed that it was the city of Lahore (in present-day Pakistan), her grandmother's hometown.

She shared with the students the accounts that she had heard from people who had survived the communal riots amidst the growing tension between India and the newly formed nation of Pakistan. Her anecdotes included one from her own grandmother who had to leave her home in Lahore due to the rising tensions and escalating situations of the Hindu-Muslim-Sikh riots during the Partition.

Amongst the numerous interviews she had conducted with people who witnessed all that transpired at that time, there were accounts from those who were children back then and even though they could not make much of what was happening around them, they remembered how they felt while evacuating their homes and what challenges they had faced. As she concluded with a picture of herself at the Wagah-Attari border, she pointed out that despite all differences, people, are essentially the same and even though a border was drawn between two parts of the same nation, in the hearts of those who experienced and lived on the other side, the border is merely physical.

Celebrating Shri Anil Jauhar's Birth Anniversary, January 20, 2023



On January 20, the School celebrated the birthday of the former Chairman of the School, Shri Anil Jauhar, with a poignant and memorable assembly. 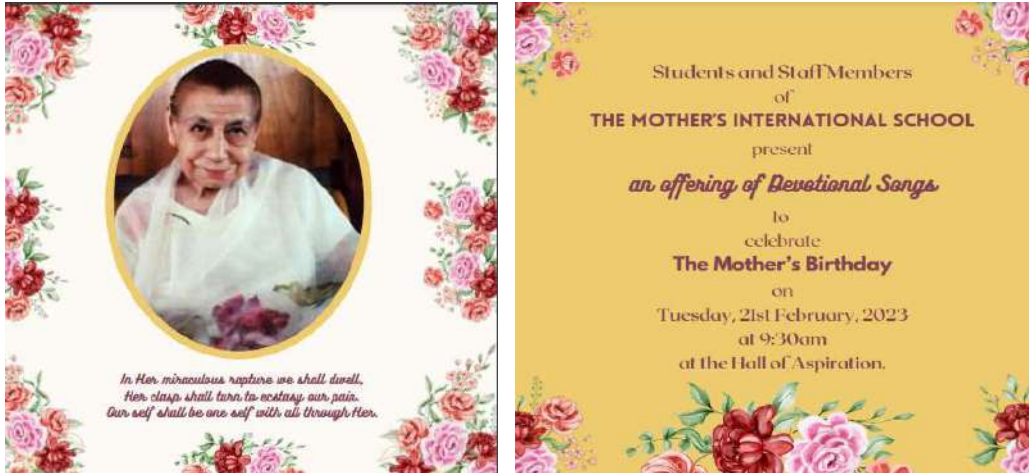

AI Shaping the Future of Education, February 24, 2023

A workshop on 'Artificial Intelligence Shaping the Future of Education' was organised on February 24, 2023, in Computer Lab 3. The resource person was Dr Rijaul Karim Barhuiya, Assistant Professor, CIET. He initiated the workshop with a discussion around how automation is going to change the employment landscape and create a skilled workforce with multi-disciplinary abilities. Ruling out the possibility of technology replacing the educators, he elaborated on how a teacher's job would undergo changes. He also discussed how ChatGPT can be used as an effective tool by teachers. He patiently answered the queries of teachers and highlighted the use of AI in career guidance, maintaining cumulative records of students, understanding their stress triggers (within and outside the classroom), analysing holistic learner behaviour and help predict future academic performance. The workshop provided an interactive platform to help clarify various myths about AI. The ethics revolving around Personal Identifiable Information (PII) were also discussed.

Yoga Session for teachers of the Senior Wing, February 24, 2023

A yoga session was organised in the yoga room for the teachers of the senior wing. Yoga was introduced not only as a mode of physical fitness but as a way of life. The importance of positivity in all the small acts we do, the kindness we show to our body right from the time we wake up, all add up to nurturing our body. Yoga is a process of realisation which creates harmony within.

The teachers were introduced to the importance of breathing. Different methods of breathing were demonstrated and instructed for the attendees to follow. This had a calming effect and set the pace for the session. The teachers were also introduced to a few simple *asans* and were asked to do it according to their flexibility. The movements were interspersed with reminders to act consciously as we breathe, move and stretch. The importance of eating fresh food at regular intervals was also reiterated as part of building inner consciousness. Teachers thus found an opportunity to reflect on their own lifestyle which was a welcome break from their otherwise busy schedule.

Integrated Project Day - Class 3, February ..., 2023

School Trips

Group trips are an integral part of activities planned for students of the School and looked forward to by students and teachers alike. The collective travel enables adaptive harmony and bonding with peers and teachers. For the teachers, it provides an opportunity to know the students better. As co-travellers the shared experiences guide the students towards some essential life skills.

- Team-work and decision making (during evening activities, treks, etc.)
- Conflict resolution, adjustment, and similar social skills as they share their dormitories with their peers.

The experiences help them to be present in the moment while eating, playing, trekking, and exercising. They practice mindful living individually and collectively.

Talla Ramgarh

September 30 to October 4, 2022

The activity brought them closer to the new learnings they had acquired in the Ashram. It also allowed them to reflect on their observations about their surroundings. To make the stay more memorable, on night of November 7, students enjoyed a bonfire where they sang songs and shared stories.

On morning of November 8, after a healthy breakfast, students were ready to return to Delhi. Forty-five students of Class XI could be seen brimming with excitement on platform no. 3 of Nizamudin Railway Station, waiting to embark on their journey towards the remote village of Kechla in Odisha. The group reached Koraput the next day. This was followed by the much-awaited ferry ride which took them to their destination 'Kechla'. The next four days were packed with activities. Students were divided into three groups for morning *Shramdaan* for kitchen work, gardening and dorm cleaning. Puducherry

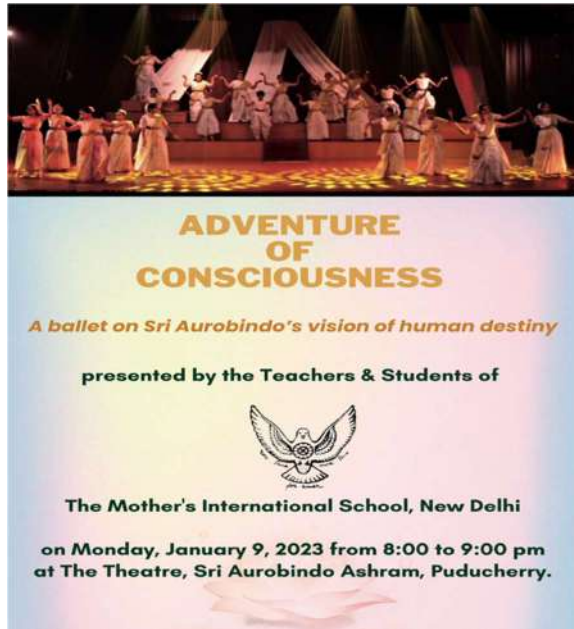
January 8-16, 2023

Mirambika Free Progress School

Annual Report 22-23

After the pandemic the new session began on the 4th of April, 2022 with all the children and diyaas gathered in the Mirambika Meditation hall, invoking The Mother's and Sri Aurobindo's blessings through concentration, chants of mantras and songs. The senior most group entered into their new group with a lighted lamp and flowers arranged on leaves with their new group diya. In this way, every group stepped into the new group with new hope, excitement and a joyous feeling. Then the self-interactions and reflections took place with the new group diya. The year was filled with joy and learning, hewing a forward path for the journey through art and craft, music, dance and drama, project work, academic skill and physical education.



Welcoming the Nursery Group Children

Our new Red Group children and their parents were welcomed to the mirambika family on the month of April with orientation programmes for both children and parents. The parents participated in two orientation programmes which introduced them to Integral Education and learning methods practiced in mirambika. The children very soon settled in the loving and caring atmosphere and involved themselves in creative work and expressions through nature, toys, games, art and craft, drawing, colouring, song and dance. They all spent their days in their favourite places, the Sand Pit and Joy Park.

Learning Activities

Project-based learning involves children's thinking, designing, developing and hand skill solutions to a problem. Mirambika's educational value is that it aims to build children's creative capacity to work through difficult problems, commonly in small groups. Based on this, mirambika children took several project throughout the year.

The **Red Group** children were busy with exploring their own group surroundings, classroom setting and other areas of school. The project on rainbow and friendship with colors was a natural consequence of this. Children spent more time with nature by collecting flowers, leaves, sticks, feathers and stones and arranged them in their groups.



The **Blue Group** children worked on group settings and explored their new group with blocks, soft toys, book corner, kitchen set area and free hand drawing. They did a rainbow and puppets show. They created stories through puppets and sang songs which were all a part of language development also.



Janamdin topic is chosen to enhance the children's understanding about festivals and experience our surroundings by engaging in activities like song, dance, making Rakhi and eating makhan and marching to the beat of patriotic songs. It brings lots of happiness, joy, caring, sharing and togetherness.

The **Green Group** was introduced to Devanagari script of Hindi language with the help of 'Akshar dost'. They began with alphabet songs like kakhagaghagha se hum **ghulmilkarrahenge** Kshya, Tra, Gyan gyan se hum **gyaanbadhayenge**. Ha se hum **himmatbadhayenge**. The song 'Akshar dost' helped children to carefully observe their life actions and their surroundings. They tried to identify the actions which helps them to increase their know ledge and to spread love. They identified the actions which requires courage and

the routine life activities they tend to do on time. Children could read words 'without Matras', with the help of objects and pictures.



After the rains, insects are seen all around in the surroundings and children of this age like to see and observe them. Children saw some snails on the way, and stopped to observe them. After observing their interest and aspiration, they selected the subject of insects and other creatures. The purpose of working on this topic was to increase the observation power of children, to drive away their fear of insects, and to help them learn about the nature of insects and other creatures. Together the children had made a garden for insects. They picked up soil and decorated the garden for insects by making different insects using different material. Using clay, they made ants, using ice cream sticks and from paper they made the dragonfly, spider and spider's web, bee, and the snail. Children identified the insects displayed in the group and read their names and also read short sentences and sang songs with action about insects to the children of Blue



and Yellow group. They made riddles on different insects and asked the children of Blue group to solve these.

At the beginning of the new session the **Yellow Group** children had made friendship with the new group and diyas. The English language was introduced and children started with words, and simple phrases and sentences. Children worked in Nature with materials of their classroom surroundings.



To increase children's observation, curiosity and develop sensitivity towards the creatures, they took the project on Insects. The children recognized some of the worms and insects around us and observed their nature, way of living and how they help us.

The Orange Group project started with their aspiration sharing for themselves (what they want to develop in the orange group). A discussion as well as reading happened on what the Mother has said about **An Ideal Child**. Through stories they tried to understand the meaning of each of the qualities. They expressed their own experiences on each of the qualities both orally and in writing. Different reflective questions on which they reflected are: Am I an Ideal child, real life incidents etc. They expressed their own experiences on each of the qualities both orally and in writing.



Before Independence Day, Orange group children took the topic on '**India**'. Since it was India's 75th Birthday and Sri Aurobindo's 150th Birth Anniversary, they felt it would be meaningful for them to know about their own country and about the contribution of Sri Aurobindo. Children took great interest while working on this topic. The topic started with reading about the freedom struggle of India and how the Indian freedom fighters fought for India's freedom. Children read different freedom fighters' national symbols, listening to Sri Aurobindo's life story, learning to recite the poem "Golden Light" written by Sri Aurobindo. Children also looked at the India map and learned to see the states and



capitals name in that and made a big India Map.

The topic started with a discussion on ‘what is light?’ and “what are the different sources of light?”.

On this topic, children’s first focus was activities related to ‘Festival of Light-Diwali’. They painted the diyas and put wax in them and learnt chants and dance movements of Mother Kali. The aim of this topic was to give children an exposure to various concepts of ‘Light’ and natural and artificial sources of light and get knowledge about the light and shadow, inner and outer light.



Courage Group took up naming the group and experimental Maths. Children started by writing about their own strengths and qualities within the framework of The Mother’s symbol. Using the same colour palette, we created a game and were pleasantly surprised to be conferred the name Courage. Children did experimental maths by making buttermilk in the group and wrote down ingredients and their measurements. Then they got an idea beforehand how much of each ingredients we would need for 100 persons.



The India project approached not by historical timeline of textbooks but by invoking the power of the rishis, the endurance and strength of their inner fire of tapas, taking pure resolve (drawing from Vaidiksankalp) truth, light and the spirit and ethos of Mother India into our hearts and soul. The seven rishis who shine upon us now even as a harmonious constellation of light, brought us the knowledge of dealing with our inner and outer domains, the power of consciousness that could defeat armies, the beauty of music and instruments, the wonder of natyashastra, the making of a stable society and the blossoming of education as inner light and knowing.



At the beginning, **Peace Group** took the project Universe and Water. One day one child identified ‘Universe’ as the project. A big dome using a readymade iron structure was constructed to create space and to hang sun and the other planets. This activity helped the children to get connected to the topic and evoked their curiosity. They were prepared to take up the study in depth and research on it and got an idea about the comparative size of the planets in relation to the sun. Their hand skills of making the planets got developed and the group studied about inner and outer planets, solar and lunar eclipses, phases of moon, galaxies, nebulae, comets, asteroids, meteors, oort clouds and star clusters, life of a star. The concepts of day and night, eclipses, phases of the moon were explained with models. Each child was given opportunity to all the types of models.

This project electricity aimed a developing reasoning and scientific thinking skills: questioning, observing, finding similarities and differences, analysing and drawing out conclusion. It covered

a wide range of concepts: static electricity; conductors and insulators; open, series and parallel circuits; voltage, resistor. The children researched about 'Who discovered electricity'. Several interesting activities were carried out to execute the above concepts.

The project on water started with experiments on 'Floating and Sinking'. The children were asked 'Why do some objects float and some sink?' Experiment with water and objects like stone, feather, fevicol, mustard oil, lemon, potato, onion, pencil, eraser, shaving blade, chalk, cloth and paper were carried out. Flat aluminium foil was on water and then the same aluminium foil crumpled was put. The flat one floated and the crumpled one sank half. From this experiment the children understood the reason for floating and sinking. Lemon was put in normal water and salt water. In normal water it sank and in salt water is floated. To learn how rain happens and for the understanding of the Water Cycle, the children watched water getting boiled and vapour coming out. The children put their hands on the vapor and felt moist on the surface of their palms. They kept salt water in the sun and after 3 hours they saw that no water was left but only salt. They made diagrams of the water cycle. Children also discussed about the sources of water. Hence the idea of making the map of India and showing rives on it came to existence.



Top Groups

The Equality Group did a project on Rabindranath Tagore. Following a discussion amongst the children, they took interest in the study of Tagore's philosophy, music, art and freedom struggle, and reflected on how they felt when the project was proposed. What have they learnt through this project and what has Tagore taught us? Children also took on an India project with emphasis on a few states. They studied details on physiography, climate, environment, economy and History, Culture, Language, Dance, Music and Arts through collection of information from books, videos and internet and prepared scrap books with appropriate pictures.

Next Children worked on musicians, instruments, folk music and music of the world during the medieval period and presented their projects related to the musicians of different periods. (Ancient, Medieval and Modern). Places where they flourished, mapping the states. Their contributions to Music and instruments used by them. They also attended sessions in the AV theatrette where they "attended" classical concerts, both Indian and Western as well as fusion, allowed themselves to soak he music in and wrote reviews of the concerts. There was an emphasis to observe what the music was conveying to them in terms of feelings and moods and how they were in turn touched by the musical pieces and the state of being each concert brought them to.



The food and light was taken by the Humility group. This project combines our body, nutrition, food and its cultivation as also the ways it is cooked. Children will make and serve these to the others so as to understand how a large number of people can be catered for.

The reflection of a laser made the understanding of the properties of light clear. Children defined what was light and how it travelled. The exploration continued with other forms of light both within

and around us. Children also worked on musicians, instruments, folk music and music of the world during the medieval period and presented their projects related to the different periods like ancient, medieval and modern. Mapping the states where they flourished and their contribution to the music world.



Heat and temperature was also another area taken up. To add to the understanding of heat and temperature, children tried observing and studying heating devices at home.



The children of both equality and humility groups compiled a newspaper each for their respective groups. groups worked with enthusiasm, independently and also as a collected articles from newspapers related to current affairs, them in the form of a newspaper. Equality group has prepared the name of 'MbK Times' which includes cartoons and games articles. Humility group has presented the news in the form newspaper in the name of 'Mira Times', and compiled various news articles.

Humanity

Children studied about the three ages in Human history namely the Stone Age, the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. Each of these ages saw the evolution of the understanding of metals and it concluded with an understanding of the mining of coal, petroleum, transportation and differentiation and the importance of

its controlling pollution.

Democracy was the area for children. They read and discussed the events that led to the partition of India and its freedom, the formation of the democracy and its need.

Then importance of elections, rights and duties and ways to be a good citizen were discussed.

Skill Corners

Children explored figure Drawing, Clay-Modelling, Wire-Works for about 5 to 6 weeks each. On the occasion of mirambika's birthday, children set up their exhibition.

Music Exploration – Children explored music with Kausalya didi singing new songs and with a variety of variations and speed. Children enjoyed these songs very much. They were classical songs, such as Shakti Sahita Ganapatim. Children learnt Rabindranath Tagore's songs such as Abunair Poroshmoni and Eckla Chalore. They also sang mirambika songs beautifully for mirambika's birthday.

Exploration of Art: During the sessions children explored hand skills through art. They learnt and created various type of art on related to surroundings, nature, flowers, butterfly etc.

Physical Education

Physical education and sports is an integral part of mirambika's way of being. Sports day marks a milestone in the children's strength and skills attainment. Physical well-being remains an important pivot of integral education.

Both younger and older children participated in Jungle stories, German games, Gymnastic, Rope Mallakhamb, Hoola hoop and Cycling,

As an offering mirambika celebrated Rabindranath Jayanti, mirambika birthday, Sri Aurobindo's Birth Anniversary, Janmashtami, Rakshabandhan, Ganesh Christmas, The Mother's Birth Anniversary and Thanksgiving. Children themselves organised the Science Mela, Math Mela, Kavi Samilani, and project presentations in full spirit on different occasions. On the occasion of Sri Rabindranath Tagore's birthday, children sang and danced to a Tagore's song.

Celebrating the 41st birthday, mirambika children offered songs, dance and Nukad Natak on No Plastics. Children set up exhibitions. On the occasion of Mirambika's birthday, the parents of Red and Blue group showed puppet show and a play on friendship.

On the occasion of RakshaBandhan, Indian mythological stories related to the origin of **RakshaBandhan** were presented by diya. Children enjoyed the play and related the value of tying Rakhi around the wrist. Before that, children happily made ladoos and rakhis for the mirambika family.

Children celebrated 150th Birthday Anniversary of Sri Aurobindo and 75th years of Independence with joy and enthusiasm.
