1. INTRODUCTION

Sri Aurobindo Education Society (SAES) was founded in 1964 to foster in the coming generations the art of living a life full of love, peace, joy and fulfillment, a life that is meaningful to them and beneficial to others. With this overall vision, among its first activities was The Mother's International School (The MIS).

The MIS was started in 1956 and its management was handed over to the Society in 1964. Today The MIS has around 2400 students and has been ranked among the best schools of the country in several surveys over the years.

In the just released Cfore School Rankings for 2024, The Mother's International School has been **ranked at No. 6 under India's Best Co-Ed School (Indian Curriculum) and ranked at No. 3 in Delhi under the same category.**

Mirambika Free Progress School, another educational institution run by the Society, was founded in 1981. It is an innovative school with about 150 students and has repeatedly been recognized as the top innovative school in the country on the parameters of Life Skills Education, Conflict Management and Individual Attention to Students.

Although both the schools follow distinct methodology for teaching and learning, both strive to achieve excellence in education, based on the Integral philosophy of Sri Aurobindo.

The Society, for the past several years, has been making all out efforts to enter in the domain of higher education and has submitted its proposal to start an Engineering College. The proposal also received approval from the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the apex body and a Regulator of Technical Education in the Country.

However, it is yet to receive the NOC and affiliation from the State govt. and its various Departments. The matter is now subjudice and under consideration with The Delhi High Court.



History Week Celebrations

May 4-11, 2023



History Week gave students an opportunity to explore various aspects of the subject namely, the archaeological sources, historical personalities and events that have shaped the past. Students of grade VI, drew sketches of historical figures and monuments from ancient India. Students of grade VII conducted research on historical figures, drew illustrated timelines, and developed maps of the era they had selected. The life and achievements of an important historical figure were described by students in period costumes. Students of grade VIII participated and learnt about the role of leaders of the 18th and early 19th century (Colonial Period) in India. They drew illustrations, wrote poems, drew maps to highlight the role of leaders like Tipu Sultan, Queen Chinnamma, Mangal Pandey, Rani Lakshmi Bai, Siraj-ud-daulah, Maharaja Ranjit Singh, Veer Satya Surendra Sai. Students of grade XI undertook the project of recreating seals and tablets from the Mesopotamian civilization. They researched and recreated specific tablets from the period. Students used clay, plaster of Paris, and other materials to design these seals and came up with



very creative presentations. The work of the students displayed on boards in the foyer and in classrooms was appreciated by all.

IMPLICATA'23

May 4, 2023

On May 4, 2023, the 3M club organised its annual intra-school psychology competition. This year the theme was 'Shakespeare.' Participants analysed popular Shakespearean characters through psychological schools of thought and creatively presented their analyses. Originally, twenty teams, each with two to four participants, registered themselves for the event. The screening round was based on PowerPoint presentations. Ten teams made it to the final round. Srishti Sinha and Neychelle Tyrone Ouseph, both alumni members adjudicated the unique viewpoints on psychological principles. Performances based on art forms like dance, poetry and drama were a part of the competition.

Rabindra Jayanti

May 9 -10, 2023



Rabindra Jayanti was celebrated on May 9, 2023, by grades IX-XII and on May 10, 2023 by grades VI-VIII. The special assembly started out with the inaugural song '*He Nuton*' and was followed by recitations from the Gitanjali. A brief history of Rabindranath Tagore's life and work at Santiniketan was presented through a short film. Tagore's '*Tota Kahinee*' or 'The Parrot's Training', a critique of the moribund colonial system of education was presented by students in the '*Dastangoi*' tradition. This was followed by dances set to *Rabindra Sangeet*.

Session on First Aid and Medical Emergencies

May 9, 2023

A comprehensive session on handling Medical Emergencies and First Aid by Dr Medha Joshi was organised by the Synapse Club (Biology Club) of MIS.

The aim of the session was to equip the audience with the necessary knowledge and skills to respond effectively during medical emergencies. Dr Joshi from Fosma Maritime Institute, Noida, shared a Powerpoint presentation on medical emergencies including Cardiovascular Emergencies, Choking and Airway Obstruction, Bleeding and Wound Management, Fractures and Bone Injuries. Practical demonstration of techniques followed by a question and answer session were particularly helpful for students.

International Yoga Day

June 21, 2023

The International Day of Yoga has been celebrated across the world annually on June 21 since 2015, following its inception in the United Nations General Assembly in 2014. MIS celebrated this special day through a collective session on meditation and yogic asanas at 6:30 in the morning. By dedicating time to practice yoga and meditation, one can improve one's physical health, increase mental focus and clarity, enhance emotional well-being, and find solace in the midst of the demands of a fast-paced world.



Fitoor Annual Workshop

June 15-16, 2023



'Fitoor', the School's Drama Club organised its annual summer workshop, 'AIZAZ' to provide an opportunity to explore different avenues from acting, scripting to even directing. Two notable resource people mentored the students on various aspects of dramatics. Mr. Ravi Raj Sagar engaged the students in an interesting table read of the play- Pygmalion. The students analysed the emotions of the characters along with voice modulation and character development, followed by a short exercise on stage movement. Ms. Tripti Kaur, a Film and Theatre graduate, shared her knowledge and passion for the dramatic arts by providing invaluable insights into the world of theater, inspiring students to explore their creativity. She tailored several group and solo activities- ranging from voice projection and modulation to movement while covering all the basics of theatre.

A Sports Camp was conducted from 6:30 to 8:30 am, allowing the students to start their day with physical activity and sports training. The camp offered training in three popular sports: Badminton, Basketball, and Football. 

What happens to a dream deferred? Students contemplated as poet Jamaal Akbari invoked Langston Hughes for teenagers, who are at that crucial point in their lives where they seek answers. Jamaal Amir Akbari, award-winning poet, arts educator, creative entrepreneur, songwriter and performing artist, addressed all the students of class 12.

The students entered the world of the spoken word as Akbari recalled his childhood and mentioned how poetry helped him find himself in an urban jungle that tries its best to suppress all forms of uniqueness and creativity. He spoke of how slam poetry helped him to connect with his emotions and express his gratitude for the tiny things in life that sustain all of us: love, family and friends. His speech resonated with the students, especially because it was a speech that addressed the uncomfortable compromise the youth often make as they enter adulthood between their dreams and expectations from the world.

Fields Day

July 20, 2023

The Fields Medal is the highest honour a mathematician can receive and is often referred to as the Nobel Prize of Mathematics. At MIS, Fields Day is celebrated annually to nurture awareness of the presence of Mathematics in our everyday life. Whether using measurements in a recipe or deciding the next move in a game, Mathematics is present in everything. Real life examples help to kindle a spark of practical interest in the students. This year, Fields Day was celebrated on July 20. Children of classes 6 to 8 created stalls in their classrooms displaying various Mathematical concepts.

The students of class 6 made innovative board games. Each child displayed the game on the table and students of other classes came to play and be a part of it.

Students of class 7 decorated their classrooms with mathematical Torans and canvas tiles using geometrical shapes. Some of the children even created Gothic design, mathematical window tile. The excitement of the kids was palpable as they even




beautified the corridors with mathematical rangoli.

July 20, 2023



World Environment Day

July 27, 2023

The Environment Club organised a special assembly to underscore the importance of conservation to draw curtains on the World Environment Day celebrations.

The assembly started with giving awards to students who secured the winning positions in various competitions held on June 5, 2023. The spectrum of competitive events ranged from poetry writing and poster making to article writing in both Hindi and English. The winners were felicitated with e-certificates and special animal-shaped planters. This was followed by a presentation by a group of students on the effects of noise pollution. They included the findings from a survey conducted within school premises, pinpointing the noisiest areas. It was a reminder that pollution is not just about dirty air or water but also about the noise around us which affects people as well as all other living creatures.

One of the much-awaited events was the unveiling of the third edition of the Environmental webzine, 'Prakriti', by Principal Milan Mala Sarin. Prakriti offers a creative, open space where students can share their thoughts, findings and enthusiasm about environmental concerns. The programme culminated with a song on the importance of conserving water.

Mathematics Day

August 5, 2023

Class 9 celebrated Mathematics Day by displaying models that were made by the students with the help and guidance of their teachers. It was an attempt to enable students to grasp mathematical concepts using practical yet creative and real life examples.

The 151st birth anniversary of the poet-seer Sri Aurobindo was celebrated through the annual Inter-school Competition, **Luminaire**.

The event aimed at discovering novel ways of looking at the world and bringing about a conscious change, envisioning a new paradigm for sustainable living and development. Participating teams identified an environmental concern related to the four elements, earth, air, water and fire, and conducted research-based analysis of the same to offer possible solutions. **Luminaire** comprised three events, spread over two days. Eight schools across Delhi-NCR participated in the final round.



On August 7, '**Green Canvas**', the poster-making competition was held in the Senior Art Room. The posters on environmental themes chosen by the teams were evaluated by Ms Deepali Sharma, the Creative Head of Think Inc Studio and Mr Abhiroopa Mathur, a Communication Design Specialist. '**Azure**', the poetry-writing competition, was held in the Primary Library. Opening lines for poems, based on the themes chosen by the teams, were provided to the participants. The poems were judged by Smt. Vinita Chaturvedi and Dr Charu Chopra, Associate Professors with the Department of English, University of Delhi.

On August 8, during the event titled '**The Good Earth**', students presented their research-based analysis of an environmental concern. The themes covered in the presentations ranged from stubble burning, waste generated from e-commerce, water scarcity to mindful living through incorporating sustainability in urban development.

The Chief Guest on the occasion was Ms Sunita Narain, distinguished environmentalist and Director General of the Centre for Science and Environment. The panel of judges for the evaluation process comprised Dr Sulagna Chattopadhyay, Editor of 'Geography and You', Prof. Chirashree Ghosh, Founder

of the Centre for Environmental Studies and Disaster Management at Miranda House and Shivaji College, DU, and Mr Arunesh Karkun, Senior Research Associate at the Centre for Policy Research.

Raga Symphony, the School Orchestra, presented the moods of nature through harmonic notes woven into intricate rhythms through their musical presentation '***Her Pulse***'.

In her address, Ms Sunita Narain lauded the precision and synchronisation of the talented young musicians. She highlighted the absence of equitable distribution of community resources and encouraged students to play a conscious role in bringing about a positive change. Her inspiring words, interspersed with alarming statistics and compelling case studies, provided ample food for thought for all.



This was followed by the prize distribution ceremony. The results were announced by the Principal, Milan Mala Sarin. Ms Sunita Narain then felicitated the prize winners.

Titled ‘*Bharatvarsham: The Spirit Incarnate*’, the production was a concept musical. Varied dance forms, from ancient classical dances to folk dances blended together to create a rich tapestry, while vibrant music provided the rhythm and flow to the narration of excerpts from Sri Aurobindo’s writings and letters on nationalism and India’s role in the world. Unity Day


October 10, 2023

“*O beauty crystalline, The Master’s hallowed shrine, O quiet form divine, We pray and bow to Thee.*”

On 5th December, 1950, in the early hours of the morning, Sri Aurobindo withdrew from his physical body. Students and teachers of The Mother’s International School made a humble offering of devotional songs and readings from the works of the Mother and Sri Aurobindo to pay homage to the Master. The group meditation began with the strains of the bhajan ‘*Nikhil Jyoti*’ and ‘*Sri Aravindah Mam Sharanam*’. “I have become what before Time I was. A secret touch has quieted thought and sense. All things by the agent mind created pass. Into a void and mute magnificence. A momentless immensity pure and bare, I stretched an eternal everywhere.” As the students’ choir sang ‘*Ma Mira Sharanam Mama, Sri Aravinda Sharanam Mama*’, a meditative silence seemed to slowly take over.



The events that followed the Mahasamadhi of the *Master* in Pondicherry were recalled by reading an excerpt from Nirod Baran’s recollections. “The sadhaks came one by one and saw the Marvel and the Mystery, the body of the Golden Purusha in eternal sleep. The entire body was suffused with a golden

crimson hue, so fresh, so magnificent. It seemed to have lifted my pall of gloom. The Absolute, the Perfect, the Alone Has entered with his silence into space; He has fashioned these countless persons of one self; He has built a million figures of his power; He lives in all, who lived in his Vast alone, Space is himself and Time is only He." A calmness engulfed the audience, as leaves gently rustled in the winter breeze. Strains of 'Hey Chiro Diner Shurjo, Tomay Pronam Kori' filled the air. The Samadhi is not a conventional place of worship, it is vibrant with consciousness and force, radiating a constant stream of peace, light, and grace.

English Poetry Festival - Class 1 (Primary Wing)

December 6, 2023



The English Poetry Festival for Class 1 showcased group recitations of selected poems on animals, each one conveying a message. Colourful props and well-coordinated actions enhanced the appeal of the poems.

Stakeholders of River Ganga Project

December 7, 2023

Indian Institute of Public Administration conducted a training programme for about 100 students from classes 6 to 11. The event gave vital insights to the problem of pollution in River Ganga and the river basin. This included familiarising students with the course of river Ganga and the states through which it flows. The workshop was aimed at generating awareness and including students as stakeholders in the process of pollution free Ganga. It emphasised on the urgency of the situation and how everyone can be torch bearers for the required change.



Human Rights Day Assembly

December 8, 2023

An informative and enthusiastic event was conducted by the students of classes 11 and 9 to raise awareness on the topic of Human Rights to commemorate Human Rights Day (10th December). The theme of Human Rights was discussed at length during the assembly. An excerpt from Martin Luther King's historic speech, 'I have a Dream' delved deep into the injustices of racial discrimination. Human Rights, which are fundamental or basic in nature were briefly introduced by providing a basic objective of these rights and their importance in the real world. The students of Legal Studies, class 11, provided insight into the Indian constitutional provisions for Human Rights and a comparison with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, through an interactive presentation. Developing nations like Sudan have faced the most heinous violations of human rights through military coups, ethnic clashes and internal conflicts. Such wars threaten civilians: women, children and all kinds of minorities. A video was shown to depict the consequences of the Sudanese military coup in October, 2021 to help students correlate explicit and implicit consequences of violation of human rights all over the world. A meaningful song, 'Heal the World' sung by the students of class 9, evoked the power of music to transcend boundaries and differences in the world.

Organic Kitchen Garden

December 9, 2023



In line with the principles of sustainable living, the Environment Club of the School decided to start an organic kitchen garden on the school premises. Organic gardening involves working harmoniously with nature, respecting the natural elements, water, sunlight, soil, and biomass. Students were briefed on the basics of organic gardening and the technical nuances. The core principles explained to them included, recycling of the nutrients, minimizing water usage, and efficient harnessing of sunlight. The practical fieldwork commenced by plunging into the designated field. Students exhibited enthusiasm while preparing the soil, removing weeds and coarse material. They prepared seed beds by mixing vermicompost to ensure nutrient-rich soil. Saplings of cauliflower, brinjal and lettuce were planted, and seeds of spinach, wheat and fenugreek were sown. This prestigious event featured two competitions, the first being a Mathematics model-making contest spanning three hours. The subsequent day featured a language competition where participants were tasked with creatively presenting the life of the same mathematician. The event commenced with short, three-minute plays, each were meticulously evaluated by the panel of esteemed judges. Despite their brevity, the plays captivated the audience.



Ultimately, the spotlight shone on MIS students. They secured the first and second best narrator prizes. Being the host school, MIS did not compete for the Rolling Trophy and it passed on to DPS RK Puram for their innovative presentation.

Integrated Project Day Class 2 (Primary Wing)

December 15, 2023



Students of Class 2 undertook project work on the theme of water, titled, *'Neer ka Saar'* and showcased their learnings through a programme on December 15, 2023. Each section of class 2 presented a physical demonstration that included yoga, drill and dance. The exhibition on the journey and properties of water featured quizzes and a 'Conservation of Water' campaign. Children conducted experiments, showcased models on water conservation and involved parents in art, craft and water-themed games. The event concluded with a 'Flash Mob' song on conserving water.

Art Exhibition

December 16, 2023

The Art exhibition of the senior wing is a much-awaited event in the School calendar. More than a hundred artworks created by the students were on display. The artworks included paintings and drawings in various mediums and themes were as varied as the styles. Students had chosen different subjects and genres. Indian folk paintings like Madhubani and Gond found a place in the exhibition as did the artistic creations in Macrame. Christmas Carnival (Primary Wing)


December 23, 2023




Republic Day & National Voters Day Assembly

January 25, 2024





The journey to Ramgarh was smooth, the students were excited about the trip. Once there, students were involved in many activities. In the mornings, they were busy with warm up games and trekking. In the evenings, they had outdoor games like basketball or sketching and art inspired by the beauty of nature that surrounded the ashram. They were also involved in group activities, exploring skills like gymnastics, yoga, scripting and performing plays. In addition to the scent of petrichor, the aroma of Maggie, tea, and momos filled the air. Day five offered tranquillity and serenity. After participating in rappelling, the students and teachers spent time together, singing, dancing, and rehearsing for a cultural activity. The evening culminated with a bonfire, where the children showcased their performances and shared stories. The final day commenced with meditation. The children received their participation certificates for the Adventure Shibir.

Overall, this camp provided a distinctive and educational experience for all. The children learned to be more independent and acquired valuable skills for personal growth. The group felt immense gratitude towards the Ashram and everyone involved in making this camp a reality.



School Trip, Class 11, Kechla (Dist. Koraput) Dec 31, 2023 to January 13, 2024

Students of Class 11 with their teachers visited Kechla, in the hinterlands of Odisha for a community service programme, making their way through air, land and water. They went in two batches of almost 40 students each, from December, 31 to January 7 and January 8-13. Their daily activities included 'shramdaan' from 6:30AM to 8AM that entailed service towards activities in the ashram such as cutting/peeling vegetables/gardening/cleaning and so on. 





Our new session began on the 1st of April, 2023 with a new aspiration and hope for further progress. Invoking the Mother and Sri Aurobindo, all the children and diyas



offered mantra gaan with songs. With the blessings of The Mother, all children stepped into their new groups with their new diyas, carried out their first interactions and reflections for the year and went on to set up their group and decide on the group name. Children's friendship with their new diyas and the new space took place in an atmosphere of happiness and peace.

Welcoming New Comers, our Pre-School Children



To welcome all our new parents and young children to the Mirambika Family, to embark on a new journey together, an orientation program was held on the 25th of March and 1st and 4th of April. The program gave parents an introduction to Integral Education practiced in Mirambika and an idea of how parents can be involved in their child's continued growth and progress. The children stepped out of their group and involved themselves in the sandpit, with toys, art & craft and nature.

Mirambika Method

Projects offer a platform for experimental as well as self-directed learning. The Mirambika method of free progress education is facilitated mainly through projects into which is infused the practice of Sri Aurobindo's five-fold integral education. All groups took up various projects, both group and individual, and through the project-based activities found a feasible ground for the development of thoughts, ideas, the power of concentration, observation, memory, imagination and logical reasoning, together with sensory, as well as character development.

The **Red Group** children and parents explored the group and the surrounding



environment and got to know one another and their diyas. Activities were aimed at building trust and familiarity with the environment, group materials and toys, to name a few. Sensitivity was nurtured through stories. Building relationship with Dharti Maa, participating in games and exercises, art and craft and cultivating habits that help in one's progress were focal points.



Gradually diyas facilitated the development of children's fantasy through puppets and story books. Children eventually made different types of puppets, thus engaging themselves in skill work. During this topic, it was observed that the children's ability to express developed tremendously.

BLUE GROUP: In the beginning, the Blue group children continued their exploration with their new diyas and groups. After a month, they took on the project **Hamari kahaniyan**. Children listened to stories and told stories. With a little encouragement and guidance from diyas, children started expressing imaginary stories from their beautiful world. They made beautiful stories with toys, puppets, nature, and made stories with skill work and sand models. It helped the development of their language, vocabulary, speech and expression. They also took the project of pattern-design and number doston. Children did pattern design with leaves, play materials and separation of different materials. They also made friendship with numbers and got an idea about the number by using the beads, cubes and toys. They collected leaves, sticks and flowers from nature, classified and made patterns out of them from their own imagination.



GREEN GROUP:

Children were introduced to the Hindi Language through SHRUTI – the sense of hearing. As a first step towards literacy, to draw the natural curiosity of children, we playfully engaged in a listening game. The children would listen carefully to the sounds produced in their own names and pick one sound to repeat along with the group's name. Children moved on to formally begin their journey of writing in Hindi with the blessing of Lord Ganesha as we shared the story of Buddhiman Ganesh ji writing the Mahabharat. Shri Ganeshji writing the Mahabharata with his tusk as a pen ('कलम) became our inspiration. This



was done in a practical manner.

The children used bamboo sticks and peacock feathers as pens by dipping them in colour. Since they had listened to Shri Ganesh ji's story, writing with a stick pen became an interesting activity for them. Children explored Hindi Language through body parts and Hapto ki Rail Gaddi.

The next project was to engage with some aspects of initial mathematics to observe the children's understanding of number concepts. Taking guidance from The Mother's words, we created opportunities for children to play, have experiences with physical objects and have fun with such activities. By using beads and seeds **children** learnt about addition and subtraction.



YELLOW GROUP:

The Introduction of the English Language began with interactions and conversation through different activities like games time, circle time, nature walk and in the group. Gradually, they



started to understand and know the English and Hindi names. Alphabet recognition was done through different activities.

The next project was Rainy Season and experiment of evaporation and condensation and experiments on vegetables.

The weather was humid and hot. The children loved and wanted to play in the rain. It was a wonderful opportunity for us to make this interest and play a meaningful way of learning in which they could connect with nature and enjoy the learning. Children wrote poems on the rainy season and did experiments on evaporation and condensation.



While working on the Vegetable topic, children visited the Ashram vegetable garden and Sarvodaya market. Children closely observed how the vegetable plants were growing. The children sensed the with sight, touch and smell of different vegetables' leaves and drew pictures. To observe closely how the seeds sprout and grow, children grew some fenugreek plants. Children wrote observations and reflections on the activities and made poems and riddles on vegetables.



ORANGE GROUP:

Orange group started their project with Ideal Child. The main purpose was to make children aware of what the Mother has said about an ideal child. Through different stories, they understood the meaning of each of the qualities. They expressed their own experiences on each of the qualities both orally and in writing. They reflected on 'Am I an Ideal child' giving real-life incidents both in writing and through drawings relating to each quality.




To know about their Mother Land, the next project taken up by the children was India. To know more about India, they listened to the story of King Bharat, learnt about Ancient Indian education system, watched documentaries on ancient India's great scientist rishis, studied the map and also found out about undivided India, learnt what a peninsula was and what an island was, made a big India map and put the names of different states and capitals on it. They also learnt different folk dances of 10 states, ate food of different states and made presentations of the topic to other group children and also to parents.



On the topic of Animals, the children visited the zoo and were interested to know the names of different animals (in Hindi and English), knowing about carnivorous, herbivorous, and omnivorous animals, making models of different types of habitats like domestic animals, aquatic, forest, desert, grassland, and polar animals, animal sounds and baby's names and the qualities of animals.

ADITI GROUP:

Children of this group took up their group name ADITI and designed their own goals for the year. Language development in English, Hindi and Sanskrit happen simultaneously as children engage in activities. They developed and improved independent writing, speaking and comprehending. Children took various individual projects of their own choice and interest like history of writing, Civilisation, animals, Dinosaurs, Dances of India, Plants and Science experiments. Another project was on The Indian Constitution. During this project, children visited the Parliament to know about the Indian constitution. Children also made their home constitution and shared their constitution within their group and with others.



PROGRESS GROUP:

On Earth project, children of this group were introduced to the latitudes of the Earth such as the Equator, Tropic of Cancer, Tropic of Capricorn, Arctic Circle and Antarctic Circle. They understood, discussed and wrote down their learning on all the latitudes of the earth. They also learned and wrote about the Torrid Zone, the temperate zone, and the Frigid Zone. To know their curiosity, children were asked to write what they would like to know more about the earth. The sub-topics as children chose, were: Earth's atmosphere, Earth's formation, Earth's Polar Regions, Earth's inner layers, ocean formation and life under ocean.



Simple Machine: The main aim was to Learn about different kinds of simple machines and how they make our daily tasks easier. First of all they learned and understood the concept of lever – its parts and types with examples to get more clarity, its mechanism and application.



In Math, children learnt through art kolam and Fractions. To create patterns using dots as a guide, to observe and learn mathematical concepts like symmetry, equidistant points, patterns and replication and to learn to estimate distances between points to create aesthetically beautiful designs. The children were focused on learning about fractions - it's necessity, terminology, identification and comparisons between fractions, fractional parts of different things, adding fractions, like and unlike fractions and mixed numbers. They learned this through using fraction kit pieces and paper folding methods.



Harmony Group:

This group took project on Reptiles, Chess and Things. They chose snakes, crocodiles, lizard, turtle and dinosaurs.

In chess, children were introduced to how Chess evolved and spread across the world, about Chaturanga, Chess Notation, Chess Strategy, Openings, Mid-game etc and learnt tactics (analysis) chess around the world, prominent chess players, variations of Chess, ratings and rankings.



In Things, children were given a random assortment of unusual objects and asked to describe them. Since they could not recognise the objects, they were not restricted by



prior knowledge and could therefore be guided entirely by their senses. They proceeded to describe their designated objects using appearance, touch, smell, how it sounded when tapped... in short, exploring the physical properties. Various techniques – bending, coiling, joining, looping, twisting, and hammering – were explored. Children learnt about tensile strength and rigidity, and how twisting multiple strands affected both. They also learnt to create beautiful shapes, working within the constraints of the material properties



GOODNESS:

The children studied **Light** and took up different gadgets using lenses and reflection principles to describe and explain the concepts of light. Microscope, telescope, sextant, periscope were chosen. They worked on electricity included the study of different gadgets like air purifier, washing machine.

In **Hindi** the children made a sketch and wrote a graphic story. In **History** they studied different religions and the children understood that the focus and aim were the same. It was the way religion was used by the different rulers that caused the rifts that we see today. They agreed that religion was needed to keep some order in society and should not be imposed but followed by free will. In Math Mela,




children prepared games Banking Bazar and Around the World in 15 Minutes.

The object of the game was to be the person left with the most money in the end and be the one with the most properties at the end of the game.

INTEGRITY GROUP

Children of this group took various projects and activities to work and explore their hand skill and mental ability. In Math, they explored different



games like Creative Elimination Game, Mathematical Magic, Ramanujan's Birthday Magic Square etc.

In a magic square, if you add all the columns, rows and diagonals and the corner square and the middle square you will get the same sum. The ones marked in purple, blue and pink separately add up to the same sum.

In art they explored different art forms like Gond art, still life, art in everyday life, kolam etc. and did in artistic form. Children also took interest in making Kolam – a South Indian Art and presented it in different places of group.



On the project of Constitution, children visited Parliament and studied the framing of Constitution and Sri Aurobindo's contribution to Freedom. Children wrote a speech and addresses the school on our constitution and broadcast on our public address system.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Physical Education is an integral and important part of our education in mirambika. For physical fitness, mental health, team work, discipline and increased confidence, children should spend some time every day and mirambika children involve themselves in the daily games time gleefully. One of the goals of integral education is to facilitate the growth of physically fit and mentally strong individuals. The Physical Education program, Sports day, included a 2-day demonstration that took off on a colorful journey on the winter month of December. The programme began with the March Past, followed by a marathon and pyramid. All children then demonstrated their skills in Body Balance, on stilts, skates, over the skipping rope and spinning the hula hoop around their waists, hips, thighs, knees and even the neck. The **Tug of War** and **Novelty Corner** were organized by older children for the younger groups and diyas which was a very joyful event of sports day.
